



SAYOWE Founders



Dr. Sugree Charoensook - Director, Mahidol University College of Music

In 1985 Dr. Sugree received his Doctorate of Musical Arts degree from the University of Northern Colorado in Greeley, Colorado (USA), and then returned to Thailand to begin his teaching career. In 1987, he accepted a position to begin the music program at Mahidol University. In 1994, the program was officially designated the Mahidol University College of Music. He has been credited with an extensive list of accomplishments including the Mahidol University Music Campus for the General Public, located in the Seri Center (Bangkok), the Dr. Sax School of Music (Bangkok), the Bangkok Saxophone Quartet, producer of six CD's of Thai music, and authored a book on well known Thai musicians.



Dr. Gene Aitken - Advisor to the Director, Mahidol University College of Music

Professor Emeritus, University of Northern Colorado, Dr. Aitken was Director of Jazz Studies Program for 27 years. During that time the Program received more Down Beat Magazine Awards and National Endowment for the Arts grants than any other institution of higher education in the United States. In 1995, he was the 32nd individual inducted into the International Jazz Educators' Association Hall of Fame with Doc Severinson and Ella Fitzgerald. In 1985, he was awarded a Grammy Nomination for the UNC Vocal Jazz group, the UNC Axidentals. He continues to serve as an adjudicator, conductor, composer, and clinician in jazz and classical areas throughout Asia and the USA. He has written numerous articles on computer technology and the impact of technology on music education for the National Education Association, the Society of Applied Learning Technology, and others.



The SAYOWE Project

The purpose of the SAYOWE project is to provide an opportunity for young, outstanding music students from the countries of Southeast Asia to study and perform music in Thailand. This is the first time in the history of Southeast Asia that music students have been brought together to form an international orchestra, wind ensemble and chamber ensemble whose personnel are only from Southeast Asian nations.

Conductors, soloists, and artist/faculty for the SAYOWE Orchestra, Wind Ensemble and All-Nations Chamber Ensemble represent Austria, Japan, Latvia, Norway, Singapore, Thailand, and the United States of America.

The SAYOWE experience is unique because it demonstrates when people of Southeast Asia unite to work together creatively, they can achieve extraordinary results. Studying and playing music allows students from different cultures to share their common experiences. At the same time, SAYOWE brings together Buddhists, Muslims, Christians and people of other faiths for the universal goal of creating music.

The SAYOWE experience is of enormous value to these talented students encouraging them to grow as musicians, while sharing the richness of their countries' education, views, and cultures.
