He was also in Beirut on his way into Iraq and met with future project partners of American Voices' planned summer music academy program for Lebanon in 2009. His internationally syndicated opinion piece on 'Hip Hop Diplomacy' continues to draw positive attention to American Voices, and he has recently made agreements with Bangkok-based filmmaker Ryan White and Soulbird Production company in New York to make a documentary about the upcoming Unity Youth Performing Arts Academy in Iraq in July. # Unity Youth Performing Arts Academy 2008 Update

Astute readers of this newsletter will notice we have added one word to the name of our Academy program in Iraq – "Youth". We have shifted focus slightly to work primarily with young people between the ages of 8 and 25 with our music, theater and dance programs. The amount of raw talent in Iraq is mind-boggling and that this talent has gone undeveloped for some many years due to conflict and isolation is what we seek to

address. This year we are excited to bring youth from the cities of Mosul and Kirkuk into the fold as well as to expand our program to an additional academy in the city of Suleimanya. There, we will work closely with the local city and regional government to train more than 200 youth in the city's new concert hall complex. ### Still Going Strong in Iraq

Over a one-month period, Dr. Gene Aitken and John Ferguson worked with more than 300 students at three different institutions from Northern Iraq and Kirkuk. Gene coordinated a huge shipment of donated instruments, scores and materials ranging from new saxophones to methods, oboe reeds and music stands, which were distributed directly to students, young professional players and institutions according to need. Our three concerts were broadcast throughout the region on local television and enthusiastically received by large audiences hungry for more visits from the outside world....
